





Admissions

- Requirements
 - Baccalaureate degree from accredited college or university
 - Minimum of 3.0 GPA
 - Online application
 - Application Fee, Transcripts, Resume
 - 500 word statement of intent
 - Additional statement work independently online
 - 3 letters of recommendation
 - For Fall 2013 GRE scores will be required. Applicants with post-baccalaureate advanced degrees are exempt from this requirement.



• Will I have an instructor?

Pitt Online

- Yes, just as in an on-campus course.
- Will I be required to participate at set times?
 - Most courses are asynchronous, but some have specific times for virtual meetings or chat sessions.
- Is the course self-paced?
 - The technology lets you go through the courses at your own pace. Some instructors will have assignments with specific due dates.
- How will I access my grades and feedback?
 - Through Blackboard and chat sessions, e-mails, discussion boards.
- Will I interact with other students?
 - Yes, through group projects or assignments, discussion boards, chat sessions.
- Will I need to come to campus?
 - An on-campus session will be held at the beginning of the Fall Term.
- Will this be considered an online degree?
 - No, your degree will be from the University of Pittsburgh







Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening is domain 1, Math is domain 2 Then, under math numbers and operations may be the first subcategory while geometry may be the fifth subcategory. Our standards look like this;




