LIS 2328 Information Literacy Resources & Services for K-12 Students and Teachers

Summer 2012

Instructor: Sally L. Myers, Adjunct (Secondary Technology Coordinator, Penn Hills School District)

Course Description: Overview of information seeking behaviors of students and teachers in the K-12 school library environment; services and resources that directly support information literacy skills instruction; and policies that guide the use of information by students and faculty in K-12 schools.

Course Rationale: Building on the Content of LIS 2002 Retrieving Information, LIS 2325 Curriculum Resources and Services in School Library Media Centers, and LIS 2774 School Library Media Center Management, this required course for students in the SCLP will replace LIS 2658 Advanced Topics in Information Storage and Retrieval. The course will focus on four strands that have an impact on information resources and services in print, electronic and on-line formats.

- **Information seeking behavior** of K-12 students and teachers
- Information resources and services
- Information Literacy **instruction**
- **Policies and procedures** that influence information resources, services and instruction for K-12 faculty and students
